Public Notice

Section 5.4 of the City of Elizabethton National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit No. TNS075281 for discharges from the City stormwater system requires the following:

The City must submit an annual stormwater program report to the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation by September 30th of each calendar year that covers the previous fiscal year. The City may fulfill this requirement by submitting the report via e-mail. Prior to submitting the annual report to the State, the City must present the annual report at a public hearing for suggestions and comments.

The Public Hearing will be held at the City Council Chamber, City Hall, 136 South Sycamore Street, Elizabethton, TN 37643 at 6:00 P.M. on Wednesday, September 21, 2011.

Thank you for your letter and enclosures of July 17, 2008, requesting information about federally listed and proposed endangered and threatened species that might occur within the jurisdictional area of the City of Elizabethton, Carter County, Tennessee. Your request is being made in accordance with Endangered Species Act compliance requirements of the Phase II MS4 Stormwater Permitting Program. Fish and Wildlife Service biologists have reviewed your request and we offer the following comments.

We currently have no records for federally listed or proposed endangered or threatened species within or near the jurisdictional boundary shown on the maps enclosed with your correspondence. Your annual stormwater permitting program reports should indicate that activities conducted under the program during the year have not had adverse effects on federally listed or proposed species. This should fulfill your Endangered Species Act compliance requirements.

Please note, however, that we periodically receive new information about listed species. Areas that have not been surveyed in the past may contain populations of species that were not known to exist. Also, new species that occur in particular areas may be listed in the future. We recommend, therefore, that you contact us periodically to ensure that the information provided in this letter is up to date.

I contacted Jim Wildlak of the United States Department of the Interior, (FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICES) by telephone. Mr. Wildlak informed me that the City's endangered or threatened species statues had not been changed.

Mr. Widlak informed me that the City's annual stormwater permitting program reports should indicate that activities conducted under the program during the year have not had adverse effects on the on the federally listed or proposed species. Mr. Widlak also informed me that they periodically receive new information about listed species and that with periodic telephone correspondences his department will be able to keep us up to date with any changes in our jurisdiction.
